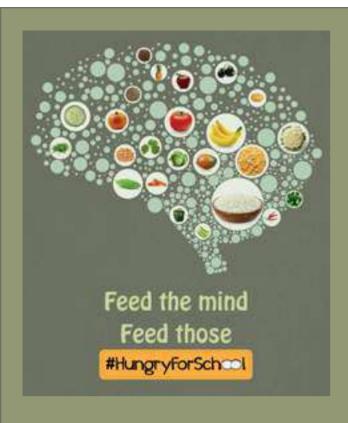

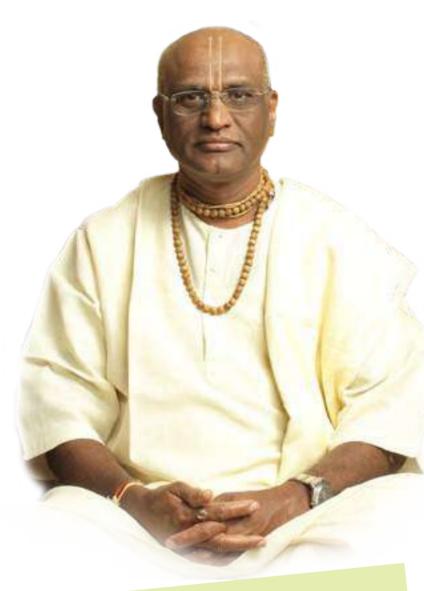


How It Started

upgraded and opened for operations

he kitchen in Mangalore has been upgraded and was formally inaugurated recently. The kitchen supplies nutritious mid-day meals to 147 Government schools in the

Dakshina Kannada district. The improvements in the kitchen include more automation in the handling and cooking of the food, thereby ensuring better quality, hygiene and efficiency in the operations process.

The kitchen has also been furnished with a new granite floor. These changes have been implemented to ensure compliance with the national standards for food safety. The kitchen will continue to serve 23,000

school children with an aim to reach 50,000 children every day.

Akshaya Patra Launched a BioUrja plant At Vadodara

kshaya Patra has once again taken concrete measures to reduce its carbon footprint with the launch of the BioUrja Plant. This bio-waste-toenergy solution has been launched at its kitchen in Vadodara, Gujarat. The plant which was funded by Alstom Foundation is used to reduce waste and replace hydrocarbon usage to save energy. This is an environment friendly means of making energy to

enable cooking in a clean, green, healthy manner. The plant supplies energy equivalent to around 115-120 kilograms of LPG per day from about 1,600-1,700 kilograms of bio-waste generated per day. This innovative system manages at least 1/3rd of the LPG needs in the kitchen at less than five per cent of the current recurring cost.

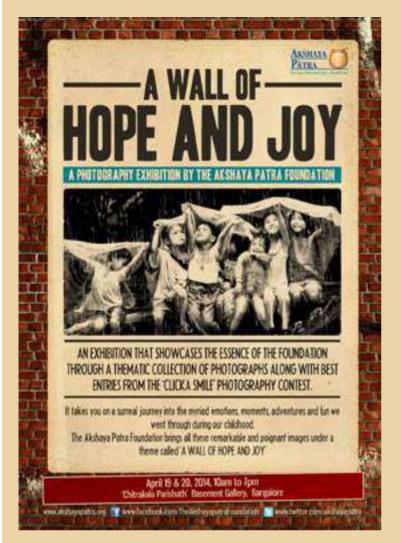

#HungryForSchool is a viral campaign running on social media websites like Facebook and Twitter. Using the hashtag #HungryForSchool, Akshaya Patra engages with donors and well-wishers via interactive, thought provoking messages. Covering a range of topics like the impact of labour on a child's future, education for the girl child, nutritional

care for children and more, the #HungryForSchool messages have gathered great momentum in the online space.

Morsel of love, starring reallife Akshaya Patra kitchen employees exemplifies the love and care with which the mid-day meals are cooked, much like a mother's love for her child. In 'What can you get for ₹ 750?' Akshaya Patra explores the different ways people can spend the amount, but showcases the real value of ₹ 750 which can feed a child for an entire academic year. 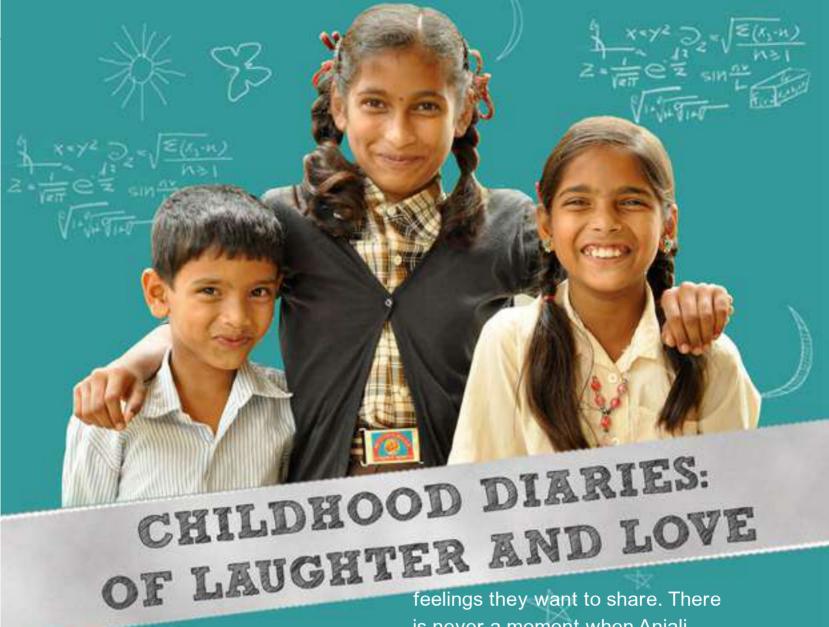

Jaga enjoys playing cricket and prefers batting. He loves to watch live matches and the last match he saw is the T20 World Cup semi-final.

Proximity of school from his home and the Akshaya Patra mid-day meal are the two immediate reasons for his regular attendance. Previously, due to financial constraints, he'd sometimes go without food. But, now he gets proper food at school and also can take leftovers to have at home. Retorting to a playful tease on his appearance of being fragile and feeble, Jaga says, "I've a lot of inner strength."



njali, Pooja and Chandu are three siblings studying in the Government Higher Primary School, Devaiahana Hundi, Mysore, Karnataka. In April 2014, a familial conflict led to the separation of their parents. Since then the three siblings stay with their father; walking up to 6 kms every day to and from school. Even though they are being raised without their mother all the three siblings display remarkable maturity for their age and wisely make choice of the

feelings they want to share. There is never a moment when Anjali or Pooja are not smiling or when Chandu is not up to some mischief.

Since their father is alone now, he cannot afford to cook for all of them. Being an Akshaya Patra beneficiary Anjali says, "We love the food we get at school. It's a lot like my mother's cooking."
